Lincolnshire councils highlight funding for Government's energy efficiency scheme

Launched in June, the Lincs 4 Warmer Homes (L4WH) scheme was set up across Greater Lincolnshire offering home energy efficiency improvements and advice.

- Loft insulation
- Cavity wall insulation

"Whilst it is important people have heating systems installed, it is key they have the appropriate insulation to ensure homes can remain warm at a reduced cost.

"I would urge all residents to get in touch with the team to find out what funding streams they could be eligible for."

"It is brilliant to be part of this energy efficiency partnership with the Greater Lincolnshire authorities. By working together we can ensure that residents have access to the best funding and advice to carry out energy efficiency improvements on their home.
